




Virtual ACR[®] AIRP[®] Rad-Path Correlation Course FAQs

July 27 – August 21; September 14-October 9; October 19-November 13, 2020

Is the registration still open? Are there places still available?

Yes, unlimited seats available to all 2020 virtual courses. Registration ends on the first day of the course.


Will the content be online to access whenever it suits me or is it live lectures where I would have to log on at a certain time to watch?

1. Synchronous lectures (lectures given live online ) will be scheduled 10 - 12 am and 1 - 4 pm (EST).
 - a. These Synchronous lectures will be made into recordings () within 24 hours and be uploaded to Canvas for attendees to view/review.
2. Presentations will be given by organ section in the schedule (Pediatric, MSK, GI, etc.)
3. Access to the course lectures (video) will be limited to the course session, as stated above. All other materials (handouts, outlines and summaries) can be found in Course Resources  folders and can be downloaded beginning two weeks before the start of the course until one week after the course ends.

How long will the online content be accessible upon completion of the course?

These Synchronous lectures will be made into recordings within 24 hours and will remain available to attendees until 2 weeks after the course ends. Asynchronous material is available two weeks before course until 2 weeks after course ends.

What do asynchronous lectures and content mean?

Asynchronous are pre-recorded lectures () and include content such as handouts, outlines, and summaries available to registrants 2 weeks before the course begins until 2 weeks after the course ends.

How is attendance registered?

All registrants must set up their profile within Canvas. This will enable tracking of participation. **Note**—*put in registrant's time zone when setting up profile; default is Mountain Standard Time (MST).*

Participation in interactive content, viewing videos, and completing assessments in the Modules section will be monitored and is the basis for receiving a certificate of completion at the end of the course.

Is the course graded?

There must be 75% participation of materials in order to receive a certificate of completion. No material is graded. Grades (or completion status) will tally daily and can be found in Canvas under “**Grades**”.

Will it take four weeks dealing with all the subjects?

Yes. Synchronous lectures (lectures given live via Zoom) will be scheduled 10 - 12 am and 1 - 4 pm (EST) Monday-Friday for four weeks.

What if I have technical difficulty viewing the recordings (spinning circle)?
